


# Aligning the panels before you start to ride



#### Align the panels

it is important to align the panels correctly, before you saddle your horse





- Before you ride, check the panels
- they must be parallel
- · not too far forward
- · not too far to the rear
- symmetrical



## The correct position for the panels


it is easy to align them - see the next steps





### Use the lines on the base


every base has 2 parallel lines at the bottom, you can place the panels against that line - this creates a normal spinal clearance for most horses



## Again the lines They are black, but clear to

see









The spinal clearance should be about 4 fingers wide.



#### The panels widen

Under pressure the channel becomes wider - bear that in mind when you place the panels under the base



No pressure

#### The panels under pressure

As you can see the chanel widens when there is weight in the saddle



With pressure

Always use panels
The Ghost is designed to
have panels - never use it
without!



- Don't remove both panels at the same time, you will have no reference anymore
- If you widen the panels, 1cm creates a 2cm extra width! That can be too much.
- If you want to move just the front or rear, do not remove them entirely, but lift just the front or rear end.
- When you are in doubt, always consult your dealer.
